ASK THE PASTORS

Q: "O LORD, who may abide in Your tent? Who may dwell on Your holy hill?" (Psalm 15:1) What is the significance of opening this psalm with a pair of questions?

A: The psalmist begins with a single question, though it is asked in two different ways as required by the structure of synonymous parallelism. The question pertains to the nature and character of the person who desires to enter God's presence. Though the question might have a general sense, it is here quite specific: if a person is to enter the special place in which God's presence is symbolized most intimately (the "tent," or temple, on the "holy mountain," namely Zion), what must that person be like? The question is vital, for the answer given to it will affect the questioner in preparation for worship. The question, if genuinely asked, will elicit an answer which invites examination of the self and hence appropriate preparation for admission to worship and to the divine presence.

The Gospel of Mark - Teacher: Almond Au (Room 102)

The shorter length of the Gospel of Mark might be mistaken to mean that it is less significant than the other gospels. Yet this book is filled with profound biblical truths about who Jesus is, and how we should respond and become a part of His ministry. We will investigate topics such as: understanding the prophecies and expectations of Jesus; the fact that Jesus is fully man and fully God; the power and authority of Jesus; and the Lordship and saving work of Jesus. Whether you're seeking to understand more about Christianity, a new believer, or many years into your Christian journey, a solid foundation in understanding the gospel of Jesus Christ is always the most significant message for your life.

Bible Bus: Life Lessons from Esther and Job – Teacher: Rev. Ted Tham (basement)

Two very different stories – one about a rags-to-riches single young girl; another about a riches-to-rags older family man. Both are compelling stories from the Old Testament that seem a world apart, but both teach us deep life lessons about ourselves and our God.
