Sermon Guide

Sermon Series: Called by God

The Book of Jeremiah is a collection of prophetic poems and stories by Jeremiah and his scribe, Baruch. Prophetic literature contains many word pictures that vividly illustrate God's love for His creation, as well as humankind's rebellion against our Creator. The poetic nature of the message aims to not only present information, but to evoke emotion in the hearers so that we would be moved to respond with repentance and worship.

In this sermon series, we will prayerfully study several poems and stories from Jeremiah. Our hope is that as we grasp God's love for us and His call on our lives, we will respond to His Word with loving worship and obedience.

Last Week: Children of God/Faithless Sons

In Jeremiah 3, God's pleads for His people to return to Him and flee from their lifestyle of idolatry. Israel and Judah are depicted as faithless and treacherous children who rebel against God and break His heart. Yet in spite of their sin, they are pursued by their loving Heavenly Father. The good news of the Bible is that God actively pursues His wayward children in order that they might repent and experience the goodness of His covenant promises.

This Week: Taking God's Name in Vain

Our passage retells an occasion when Jeremiah proclaimed a message of judgment at the temple gates that fell upon deaf ears. This response was indicative of Judah's overall unfaithfulness to their covenant with God, and they eventually experienced God's judicial wrath. The Good News of the Bible is that though we too may have taken God's name in vain, our story can end differently because Jesus' death and resurrection has made forgiveness for sin and reconciliation with our Heavenly Father possible.

Bible Study for Small Groups & Fellowships

LEAN IN: Icebreaker

1. What is the weirdest thing that you have insured (or heard someone insure)?

LOOK DOWN: Study the Scriptures

- 2. Read Jeremiah 7:1-7. What were the two messages that the people of Judah received? How were they supposed to know which one was correct?
- 3. Read Jeremiah 7:8-11. Compare the list of sins in vs 8 with the Ten Commandments. What was Jeremiah's intent when listing out these sins? Explain God's accusation when He said that they treated the temple like a 'den of robbers'.
- 4. Read Jeremiah 7:12-15 & 1 Sam 2:12-17. What happened at Shiloh? What is Jeremiah hoping to achieve by comparing Judah with both Shiloh and Israel?

LOOK OUT: Discuss

5. There are times when we may be receiving contradicting messages from reliable sources. What is your methodology in trying to figure out which message is right?

LOOK IN: Reflect & Share

- 6. Our passage highlights many attributes of God. Which attribute is most meaningful to you? Why?
- 7. Jesus washes away the penalty of sin but not the consequences of our sin. How has God helped you as you face the consequences of your sin?

LIVE IT OUT: Respond to God's Word

8. Though we may not take God's name in vain, we may still occasionally take His Word lightly, delaying in our obedience to God. Has there been something God is asking you to do that you have been putting off?
