Sermon Guide

Series: Galatians – Freedom of the Christian Freedom is defined as the power to act or speak as one wants without hindrance or restraint. The Bible says that Jesus' death on the cross has won Christians absolute freedom. If this is so, why do so many in the church view Christianity as a straitjacket, where God is restraining them from acting or speaking as they please?

The answer is that although Jesus has defeated the power of sin, many still choose to stay enslaved to sin's power, and thus refuse the transformative power of the Gospel. This sermon series explores God's promise of freedom and how we can vanquish sin's power in our lives and live as free men and women who freely and joyously worship, love, and obey our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Last week: Grace Driven Mission

The Apostle Paul was given a very specific mission from God - proclaim the Gospel to the Gentiles. Through His life we see a simple but profound reality: those who have been impacted by the gospel will live for the gospel.

We are only able to live a missional life when we have been impacted by the Gospel and empowered by the Holy Spirit to carry out God's grace driven mission for our lives.

This week: Convenient Christianity

In our passage, we read of an occasion when the Apostle Paul rebuked Peter for practicing a 'convenient Christianity', where he acted out of a 'fear of man'. Although his sin was dealt with properly, the damage was done: people turned away from God and people's obedience to God was poisoned. This episode reminds us that sin damages us and those around us. It also teaches that we must lovingly confront sinners with the Gospel of Jesus Christ so that we can respond with heartfelt repentance.

Study Questions for Small Groups & Fellowships

Icebreaker: Share a time where you witnessed an athlete/a performer 'choke' under pressure and deliver a sub-optimal or a compromised performance.

- 1. Why was it wrong for Peter to separate from the Gentiles? What message was he sending to the Gentile believers in Antioch? How might an unwelcoming church environment give people a false impression of God?
- 2. What does it mean to 'fear man' and how does this fear lead one to live as a 'Convenient Christian'? What are some life 'pressure points' that can cause us to compromise on our faith promise to God?
- 3. What were the consequences of Peter's sin. What is the difference between a consequence of sin and a penalty for sin? How does Jesus pay for the penalty of sin and shield us from the consequences of sin? Why is compromise contagious? Reflect on how compromises in your life may have influenced those around you.
- 4. How did Paul respond to Peter's sin. Why was it appropriate that Paul rebuked him publicly? What are the ingredients for Gospel-centric rebuke? How does Gospel-centric rebuke prevent someone from justifying or minimizing his/her sin? What are the dangers of merely pointing out someone's sin without pointing him/her to the cross of Christ?
- 5. Spend time confessing your sin to God and then preaching the Gospel to yourself, reminding yourself of the reality that God sees your sin, knows your failures, and yet, pursues you and offers you cleansing and forgiveness.
